

# FULL CIRCLE A MEANINGFUL CONNECTION

On this night, we will sing and dance in defiance of the destruction that was meant to be everlasting but did not succeed.

We mourn and celebrate together as a community in the face of yet another attempt to destroy the spirit of the Jewish People. This concert recognizes the agony, pride and determination of Jews in the diaspora who stand with Israel on this profoundly significant day of Kristallnacht – a day that is especially meaningful this year in the wake of October 7.

This anniversary concert is the culmination of 60 years of rich history, and the beginning of a new era of Chai. It is also a wonderful example of Jewish pride and life beyond the Holocaust and now, October 7.

We invite everyone to take pride in the tiny example of resilience represented by the long life of Chai (Hebrew for "alive"), a diaspora youth group born in a North End basement that continues, six decades on, to connect Jewish young people to each other, to their Jewish heritage and to Israeli culture. **It matters now more than ever.** 



This special number of 60 is represented by the Hebrew letter samech. Its smooth shape, closed on all sides with no end or beginning, is the symbol for support and protection. Holocaust Survivors – our greatest teachers of hope and strength. On the anniversary of the Night of Broken Glass (Kristallnacht), we will **commemorate 60 years of rebuilding**, **as we come full circle.**

It's also about the next 60 years of engaging our young people. **Chai brings alive the power of music and dance** to connect, educate, and celebrate Israeli and Jewish culture with a spirit of inclusion and belonging, and this has never been more critical.

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



s the Sarah Sommer Chai Folk Ensemble reaches the incredible milestone of 60 years, we have been reflecting on who we are as a group, including the Chai Folk Arts Council.

Tonight, as we sing, dance and make music, Chai is representing Israel and our community in the best way we know how – through the cultural artforms that communicate the stories of our people. We have always known this is what Chai does. At this moment in our history, it matters in a way that we may have taken for granted. Tonight, our ensemble takes the stage with more than 60 Chai alumni who grew up with the vision of what Chai was created for – to share, promote and celebrate the rich diversity of Israeli and Jewish culture through music and dance.

The eight girls who danced in the basement with founder Sarah Sommer (z'l) – some of whom you will see on stage tonight – became the foundation for a youth group that, for 60 years, has drawn together hundreds of young people of all faiths and backgrounds who carry this legacy forward.

Tonight, on the anniversary of Kristallnacht and on the heels of October 7, this vision and the incredible legacy born from it feel stronger than ever before.

As we dance and sing again to the music of our people, we have realized our unique ability as a cultural arts group to showcase our Jewish homeland and our diaspora communities through the lens of our people, with our people, from all our diverse backgrounds. Our movements and melodies represent the experiences of generations, woven into a glorious tapestry that reflects the diversity of Israel and Jewish communities around the world.

We are honoured to have represented Israel and the Jewish community for 60 years. As we have for 60 years, we will end our show with "Hava Netzeh B'machol," our signature finale, which translates to "let us go out and dance". We thank you for joining our Full Circle. We thank you for your unwavering support. Most important, we look forward to building bridges of joy and understanding through music and dance for many more decades to come.

## MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTORS



n anniversary is a time to reflect. The Chai Folk Ensemble began in 1964 in a basement on Salvia Bay in the North End of Winnipeg. Scenes from that era come to us in blurry, black-and-white newspaper clippings saved in scrapbooks. One article shows the Original-Eight dancers in Ottawa, performing for Queen Elizabeth II, and even in black and white, one can feel the pride, joy, and exuberance that these young Jewish teens experienced in growing up with the newly-established State of Israel.

The next era comes to us on the covers of vinyl records; the warm hue of film photographs depict the ensemble performing in blue-and-white costumes amidst the green foliage of Kildonan Park. 1970 was the first year Chai performed in Folklorama. Upon the festival's inception, celebrating the diverse cultural fabric of Manitoba, multiculturalism has been a central pillar of the ensemble.

The ensuing decades brought a more connected world, and Chai's repertoire reflects these ideas with pieces from the diaspora, spanning from Brazil and Mexico to Kurdistan and Morocco. The stories of women, immigrants, and refugees took centre stage, receiving the spotlight they deserve.

In our lifetime, Chai continues to evolve. From trips to Israel and around the world, to partnerships with the WSO and the Ukrainian dance ensemble Rusalka, the Chai Folk Ensemble reaches people worldwide with videos on social media and a discography of music on streaming services.

All of this history is merely a broad overview - in each photograph and on every album cover is a performer whose life was touched by their time in Chai. We celebrate with those alumni tonight, who will join us onstage in performing some of Chai's highlights of the past 60 years.

But an anniversary isn't only for reflecting on the past - it can also be a time to look ahead to the future. Tonight's concert will feature six new pieces of music and choreography, each building on a different facet of Chai's artistry throughout the decades.

In Hebrew, the number 60 is represented by the letter samech, which is a closed circle. The circle is the basis of Israeli dance; without beginning or end, it symbolises the ongoing flow of art, culture, and tradition from one generation to the next. Just as all points in a circle are connected to one another, our community supports and leans on each other to uphold our values, culture, and traditions. Tonight our performers, past and present, will join together to share the joy and artistry of Jewish and Israeli song and dance. Enjoy the show!

## DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHIES





SARAH SOMMER Co-Artistic Director

Sarah Sommer is an active choral conductor, vocalist and music educator in Winnipeg. She holds a Bachelor of Music (2017), Bachelor of Education (2017) and Post Baccalaureate diploma in vocal performance (2022) from the University of Manitoba, and currently teaches music and drama at Technical-Vocational High School. Along with her role as co-artistic director of Chai, Sarah is also the co-founder and co-artistic director of NUOVOCE Chamber Choir. She has appeared as choir member and soloist

with many local ensembles, including Canzona, Dead of Winter (Camerata Nova), the Winnipeg Singers, and the Shaarey Zedek Quartet. Sarah's additional directing credits, past and present, include: the Etz Chayim Synagogue Choir, Kolot Community Voices, WSD and LRSD Divisional choirs, and assisting with the Winnipeg Girls' & Boys' Choirs. Sarah first joined Chai in 2008 as a singer, and later went on to become assistant vocal director (2011-2014) and vocal director (2014-2017), before her appointment to the position of co-artistic director (2022). Sarah is honoured to be able to contribute to Chai's ongoing legacy in its 60th year and looks forward to watching Chai performers past and present share the stage together for this milestone celebration.



JESSE POPESKI Co-Artistic Director

Jesse Popeski has been a member of the Chai Folk Ensemble since 2015, first as the guitarist and music director, and now as co-artistic director. Jesse has a BA in music from the University of Manitoba and is a freelance guitarist performing in a variety of styles, from jazz in local bars and restaurants to singing old favourites at care homes through the Artists in Healthcare Manitoba program. He is also a music educator, teaching guitar to aspiring musicians of all ages at the Winnipeg Conservatory of

Music. For Jesse, the most exciting part of a Chai concert is seeing new pieces come to life onstage with the full ensemble of singers, instrumentalists, and dancers, and the variety and sophistication of the six new commissions for the 60th anniversary is sure to make for a meaningful and memorable performance.



CAMERON DENBY
Music Director

Cameron Denby is a Métis percussionist, teacher, and project director. He holds a Bachelor of Music from the University of Manitoba, and a Professional Studies Diploma from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Since returning to Winnipeg in 2019, Cameron has been creating and directing concerts and projects, including the Fresh Blood Project, an ongoing collaborative initiative between composers and percussionists. Working in a variety of circles, Cameron has performed many local

organizations, including the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the Little Opera Company, and the Winnipeg Police Pipe Band. Outside of performance, Cameron teaches private lessons on drumset, marimba, and percussion.

Grace Hrabi is a singer-songwriter and teacher with a B.A in Vocal Jazz Performance from the University of Manitoba. She has released 3 full length albums and toured across Canada with folk trio Casati. She is also a private music instructor, teaching voice, song writing, ukulele & musical theatre.



RACHAEL BUCHWALD

Dance Director

Rachael Buchwald has spent most of her life dancing! Rachael's formal training began with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet School's Recreational Division's Intensive Training Program from 2013-2017, where she completed her Advanced 1 Cecchetti examinations and studied ballet, pointe, and modern. ## **ELAN MARCHINKO**

Elan began choreographing for Chai in 2009 with the boys feature, Brider Tanse. Since then, she has reimagined existing repertoire and created new works such as Alle Brider, Mishaela, The Space Between Us, and Katonti. In her choreographies, Jewish diasporic styles are punctuated by ballet, contemporary dance, character, tap, jazz, and flamenco. For Elan, dance is a way to make space for memory. The overarching story of The Space Between Us is about the loss of the main character's childhood friend whose memory she dances with in a bittersweet between place. At first, she

is overwhelmed by the heaviness of her grief but is eventually enveloped in and comforted by their memories together-the beautiful-terrible consequence of being human, living, and loving. First created in 2017, tonight's version has been rechoreographed to reflect memories generously contributed by the current cast. Also making its debut tonight is Elecha Ekra Ya, the first piece Elan has created in the Moroccan style. It is dedicated to her most beautiful creation, Akiva.



## **REBECA SHAMAH**

## This Land: Ha'Aretz Hazot & Adama V'Shamayim (This Land, Land and Sky) הארץ הזאת

In honour of Vivian Silver, z"l. May her memory be a blessing.



Vivian Silver, a fierce peace activist and founder of the Women Wage Peace movement, was tragically murdered by Hamas terrorists on October 7, 2023. Although born in Winnipeg, Silver resided in Kibbutz Be'eri, close to the Israel/Gaza border, where she dedicated her work to fostering peaceful relations between the two communities since making Aliyah in 1974.

Chai pays tribute to Vivian's vision of peace with This Land, which was originally performed by Yael & the Mothers, of the same Women Wage Peace movement. The song expresses the shared longing and dedication to the holy land that is embedded into the ethos of both Jews and Palestinians alike, with a vision of both communities living peacefully side by side. The text, in both Hebrew and Arabic tells of these aspirations: "I won't turn my back, and my thirst will not be quenched, until my open heart is freed with the spirit, until my soul is firmly planted in the heart of this land".

Next, Adama V'shamayim is a visceral imagining of this future vision coming to fruition with a diverse community living, working, and sharing the land together in peace.

# MESSAGE FROM THE SOMMER FAMILY



t seems like yesterday when we celebrated Chai's 50th Anniversary. And here we are at the 60th. It's remarkable that Chai, which began 60 years ago in our basement at 11 Salvia Bay with just eight girls aged 11 to 13, has grown into what it is today. Our early aspirations were simple- to perform at small Jewish organizational events and Folkways, a one-performance event that later evolved into Folklorama. Like Folkways, the evolution of Chai from those modest beginnings is a testament to the power of our mother's vision and dedication, which later transferred to those who followed in her footsteps.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention Chai's greatest cheerleader. That person is none other than our father, Alex Sommer. His undying support of our mother's work went far beyond encouraging her efforts with kind words and a listening ear. On a humorous note, our father paid for the beautiful costumes we wore to perform before HRH, Queen Elizabeth, on a stage on Parliament Hill on July 1, 1967, to celebrate Canada's Centennial. As typical teenagers, we never thought twice about how our costumes suddenly materialized. Only years later, we learned how our costumes came to be.

Most importantly, when our mother passed away, our father worked tirelessly to ensure that Chai would survive without her. His commitment to our mother's legacy honored her memory and paved the way for Chai to become what it is today.

If Sarah Sommer were here today, she would be in awe of Chai's many accomplishments. As the only child of immigrant parents who struggled to make ends meet, having dance lessons was well beyond what they could provide. Yet, within our mother, there was an innate talent and passion, as well as a strong Zionist commitment, that propelled her to use dance as the medium to bring people together. And that she did!

Our world is very different from what it was 60 years ago. Now more than ever, Chai's existence demonstrates that people's similarities are much greater than their differences. Song, music and dance are the common threads that unite people and bring joy. And Chai knows precisely how to do this!

The Sommer Family is deeply grateful to each and every one of you who has supported Chai throughout the years. Without the contributions of the performers, directors, technical and support staff, board members, countless other volunteers and donors, Chai would not be here today to celebrate this milestone. Your dedication and support have been instrumental in Chai's success.
